QUARTERLY CITY PROJECTS PROGRESS REPORT

RECOMMENDATION:

Receive report and provide direction, as needed.

BACKGROUND:

The intent of the Quarterly Projects Progress report is to provide to the City Council and the public a regular update on the progress of citywide projects. This helps to gauge performance and serves as a tracking tool. Additionally, it advances the discussion of workload capacity and prioritization, along with identifying consequences of unexpected disruption or challenges. City Council last considered the Quarterly Tasks and Project Progress report at the July 16, 2024, meeting for the quarter ending June 30, 2024.

ANALYSIS:

The City of Coronado is actively advancing approximately 70 projects and initiatives. These initiatives comprise a de facto work plan approved by the City Council in an incremental fashion over time. These activities represent items of additional focus, new activities, or projects of community significance. Many of these activities have a multi-year planning and/or implementation timeline. Projects are typically above and beyond the normal duties and expectations of staffing and department performance. This report covers the 3rd calendar quarter ending September 30, 2024.

The Projects Progress Report (Attachment 1) is modeled on the Capital Improvement Projects sequencing list which was approved by City Council in June 2024 as part of the Fiscal Year 2024/25 Capital Improvement Program budget. In addition to sequencing of projects, it also contains a summary of projects, including project descriptions, projected completion date, project phase, status as of the last quarter reported and current status.

Staff requests City Council review the Quarterly Projects Progress Report and provide direction, as needed.
