ADOPTION OF “A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CORONADO, CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING THE RECEIPT AND APPROPRIATION OF FISCAL YEAR 2022-23 RIDE TO LIVE MOTORCYCLE EDUCATION GRANT FUNDS FROM THE CALIFORNIA OFFICE OF TRAFFIC SAFETY (OTS) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$65,000;” AND AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH SAN DIEGO STATE UNIVERSITY AND NATIONAL CITY FOR ASSISTANCE WITH RIDE TO LIVE EVENTS, REIMBURSABLE THROUGH OTS GRANT FUNDING

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt “A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Coronado, California, Authorizing the Receipt and Appropriation of the Fiscal Year 2022-23 Ride to Live Motorcycle Education Grant Funds from the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) in the amount of \$65,000;” and authorize the City Manager to enter into an agreement with San Diego State University (SDSU) and National City for assistance with Ride to Live events, reimbursable through OTS grant funding.

BACKGROUND:

The Ride to Live motorcycle education program is designed to provide motorcycle training to reduce injuries and deaths due to motorcycle collisions. The training is free to the public and involves hands-on skills taught by Coronado Police Department Motor Officers. Financial support for this grant is distributed in the form of direct costs and personnel costs by the Office of Traffic Safety. The Coronado Police Department has participated in this program since October 2020.

ANALYSIS:

The acceptance of this grant will allow the Coronado Police Department to purchase training supplies, rent sites, and cover the cost of overtime for those teaching the class, including officers from San Diego State University and National City Police Departments, with which the City partners for joint motorcycle training. Motorcycle collision injuries and deaths have been an issue for years. Possessing life-saving skills is critical to reducing motorcycle collision-related deaths and injuries. Educating motorcycle riders on how to safely maneuver in dangerous situations will aim at lowering the number of motorcycle collisions each year.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The City of Coronado’s award of the Fiscal Year 2023 Ride to Live Motorcycle Education grant funds is \$65,000. These funds will cover the cost of overtime for instructors, training supplies, and site fees associated with the Police Department’s Ride to Live motorcycle education program. Additionally, OTS grant funds will cover overtime costs for SDSU and National City officers to assist with Coronado Ride to Live events. The expenditure and reimbursement revenue will be recorded in the City’s Fund 240 and may be subject to Federal single audit reporting requirements in the Fiscal Year 2022-23.

ALTERNATIVE:

The City Council could choose not to accept the funds.
