CONSIDERATION OF APPOINTMENT OF ONE NEW MEMBER TO SERVE THE REMAINDER OF A TERM TO EXPIRE DECEMBER 31, 2023 AND ONE NEW MEMBER TO SERVE THE REMAINDER OF A TERM TO EXPIRE ON DECEMBER 31, 2024 ON THE MOBILITY COMMISSION

RECOMMENDATION:

Consider for appointment two new members from the submitted applications to serve the remainder of a term to expire December 31, 2023 and the remainder of the term to expire December 31, 2024 on the Mobility Commission.

BACKGROUND:

City of Coronado Administrative Procedure No. 204 and Council Policy limits the time an individual may serve on a board, commission, or committee to a maximum of two terms or eight years, whichever is less. City Council Policy No. 6 and No. 23 set forth the process for reappointing eligible incumbents and the competitive process to fill vacancies on City boards, commissions, and committees.

ANALYSIS:

There are currently two vacancies on the Mobility Commission. Commissioner Morgan Miller was first appointed to the Mobility Commission on September 3, 2019 and reappointed at the December 2, 2020 meeting. At the Regular Meeting of March 2, 2021, the City Council approved extending the terms of all board, commission, and committee members by one (1) year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. His term was set to expire on December 31, 2023 but was extended to December 31, 2024. Mr. Miller resigned from the Mobility Commission on March 13, 2023. Commissioner Jason Paguio was appointed to the Mobility Commission on September 3, 2019. At the Regular Meeting of March 2, 2021, the City Council approved extending the terms of all board, commission, and committee members by one (1) year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. His term was set to expire on December 31, 2022 but was extended to December 31, 2023. Commissioner Paguio submitted his resignation on March 7, 2023. The following individuals have submitted applications for the City Council's consideration (listed alphabetically by last name):
