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CORONADO MOBILITY COMMISSION'S 2022 ANNUAL REPORT AND 2023 WORK PLAN

RECOMMENDATION:

Accept the Coronado Mobility Commission's 2022 Annual Report and 2023 Work Plan.

BACKGROUND:

The Mobility Commission is a City Council advisory board tasked with carrying out the traffic-calming plan, helping city staff with research, planning, and implementation of the complete streets act, expanding safe, healthy, and equitable mobility options for the community, and encouraging active transportation. One of the duties of the Mobility Commission is to report annually to the City Council on its activities and work plan.

Attached is the Mobility Commission's 2022 Annual Report, which lists the Commission's accomplishments. The Commission's Work Plan for 2023 is provided below for the City Council's review.

ANALYSIS:

To accomplish its mission in 2022, the Mobility Commission organized itself into five working groups with the following responsibilities:

Traffic Calming & Active Transportation

- Increase traffic-calming measures throughout Coronado
- Improve vehicular mobility in Coronado
- Improve pedestrian safety
- Improve traffic and public safety

Bayshore Bikeway & Natures Bridge to Discovery

- Develop continuous improvements to the bike paths that allow pedestrians and cyclists to travel safely around Coronado on a dedicated path away from city streets
- Provide a vital and scenic connection for Coronado residents, bayfront employers, tourists, and recreational destinations

Ferry & Shuttle

- Reduce the number of vehicles entering Coronado
- Reduce motor vehicle usage within Coronado by improved mass transit and alternative modes of transportation

Bike Parking

- Improve bike parking in Coronado's Business District
- Improve bike parking capacity for local schools and parks
- Educate the public on the correct use of bike parking docks
- Encourage the use of U-locks to secure bikes

E-Bike

- Make recommendations to the City Council pertaining to ordinances that govern the use of E-bikes in Coronado
- Educate the public on the correct use of E-bikes
- Promote enforcement of all safety rules and vehicle code violations

As described in more detail in their report, the Mobility Commission contributed to and/or commented on various transportation-related projects in 2022, including, but not limited to:

- Working with the Coronado Police Department (CPD) to provide quarterly reports on bicycle and pedestrian incidents
- Presentations from the Climate Advisory Group and Emerald Keepers regarding the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions
- The initiation of a web-based self-reporting program for pedestrians and bicyclists to report accidents that do not involve CPD
- Placing stencils along the Tidelands Promenade

In addition to the transportation initiatives currently underway, the Commission has also focused its efforts in 2022 on the following events:

- Coronado's Annual Ride the Lights
- National Walk and Bike to School Day
- Bike Rodeos at local schools
- Bike to Work Day

The Mobility Commission proposes its working groups will serve to accomplish the following work plan items for 2023, as a continuation of the work plan from 2022:

- Improve Coronado's 'Bike Free' sidewalk zones in the business districts
- Create Traffic Calming Plan implementation strategies
- Prioritize Bayshore Bikeway phases of improvement
- Reduce ferry service rates for Coronado residents
- Support year-round expansion of the summer shuttle program
