APPROVAL OF A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CORONADO AUTHORIZING THE RECEIPT AND APPROPRIATION OF 2022 BOARD OF STATE AND COMMUNITY CORRECTONS (BSCC) FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$30,891.64 FOR OFFICER WELLNESS AND MENTAL HEALTH GRANT

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve "A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Coronado Authorizing the Receipt and Appropriation of 2022 Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) Funds in the Amount of \$30,891.64 for Officer Wellness and Mental Health Grant."

BACKGROUND:

The Officer Wellness and Mental Health Grant Program, established in the 2022 Budget Act (Assembly Bill 178, Chapter 45, Statutes of 2022), provides \$50 million for city and county law enforcement agencies for the purpose of improving officer wellness and expanding mental health sources. The funding may be used for establishing wellness units, expanding peer support units, training, services provided by licensed mental health professionals, counselors, expanding multiagency mutual aid programs focused on officer wellness and mental health and other programs and services that are evidence-based or have a successful track record of enhancing officer wellness.

ANALYSIS:

The grant allows for training, establishing wellness units, expanding peer support units, adding services by licensed mental health professionals, and expanding multi-agency mutual aid programs focused on officer wellness. The Police Department will evaluate these options and identify where best to focus the grant money. As a requirement of the grant, the Police Department will submit an expenditure report and a final impact report no later than December 1, 2025, along with a brief annual expenditure report.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) has been allocated FY 2022 Officer Wellness and Mental Health grant funds by the State of California Budget Act of 2022. The City of Coronado has received a Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 onetime upfront payment of \$30,891.64. The expenditure and reimbursement revenue will be recorded to the City's Federal Grant Fund 24021000 and may be subject to Federal single audit reporting requirements. These funds must be spent by December 1, 2025.

ALTERNATIVE:

The City Council may choose to not expend the grant funds.
